Scott replied back encouraging me to try research at work, mentioned a group.

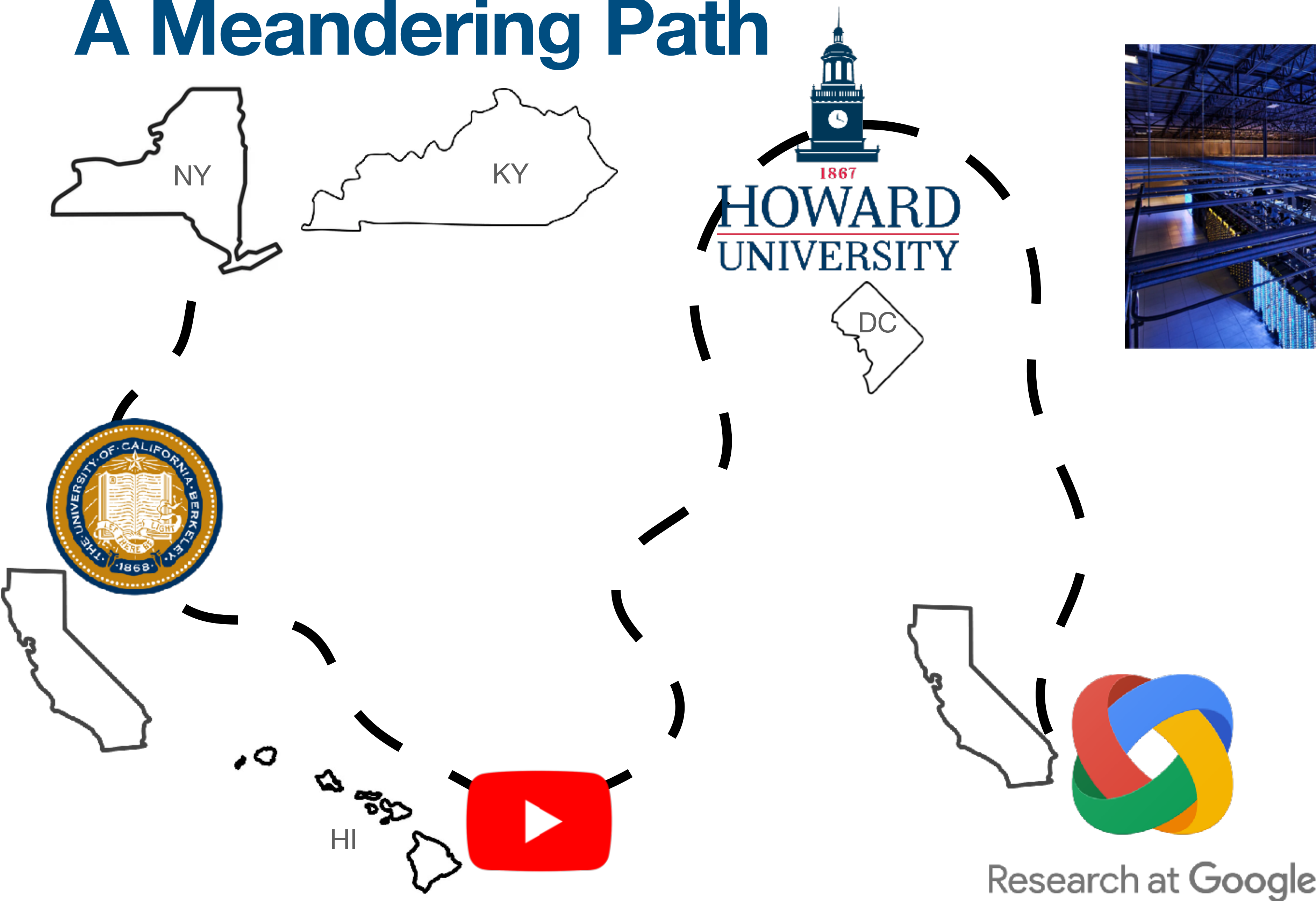
I started helping out a few hours a week in spare time.

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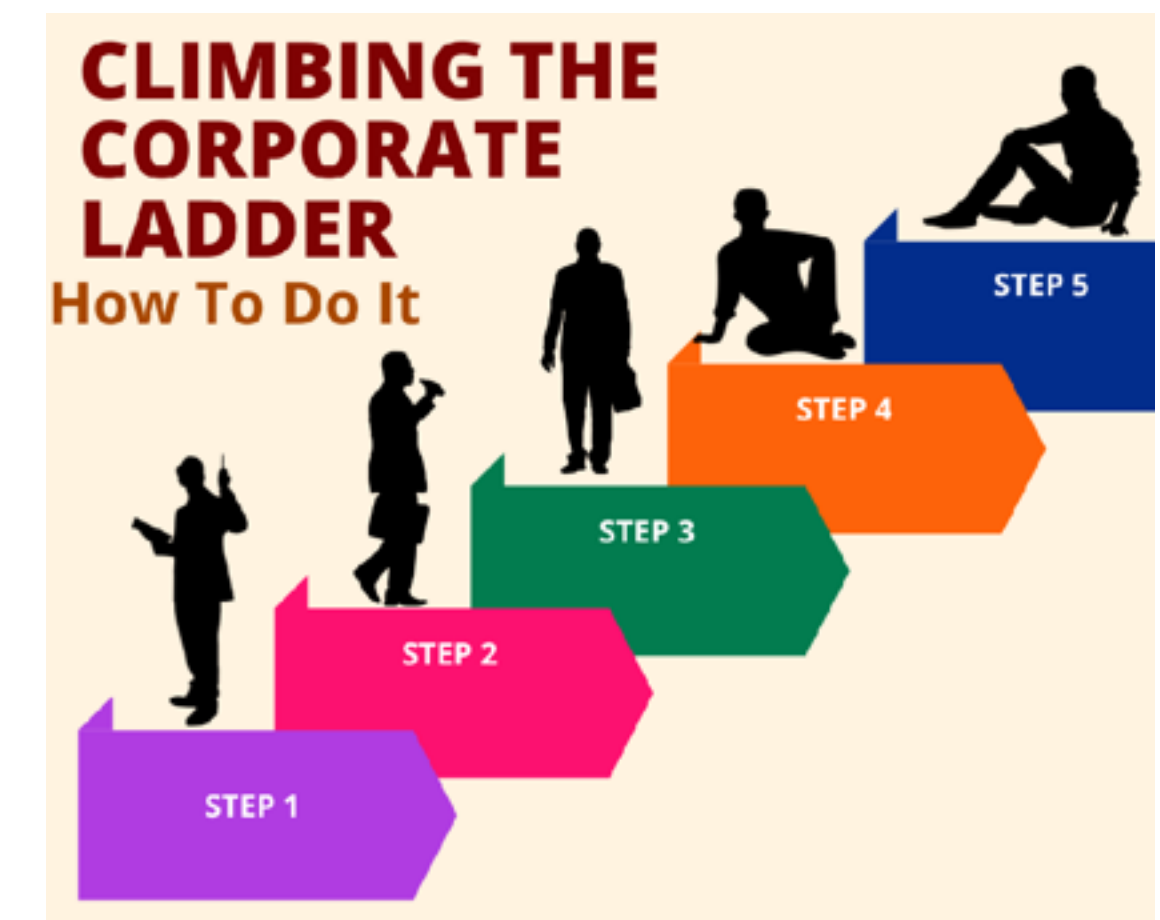
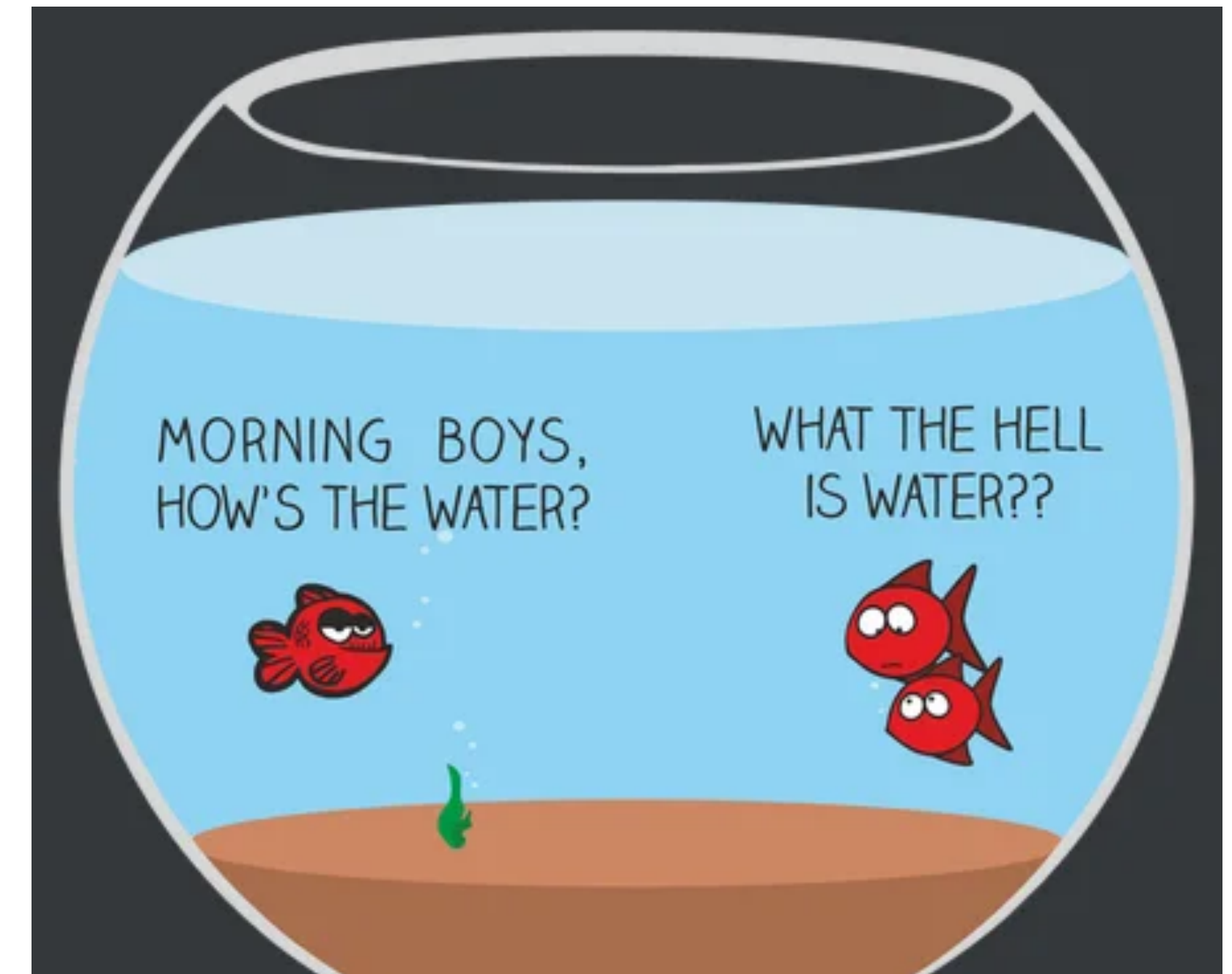


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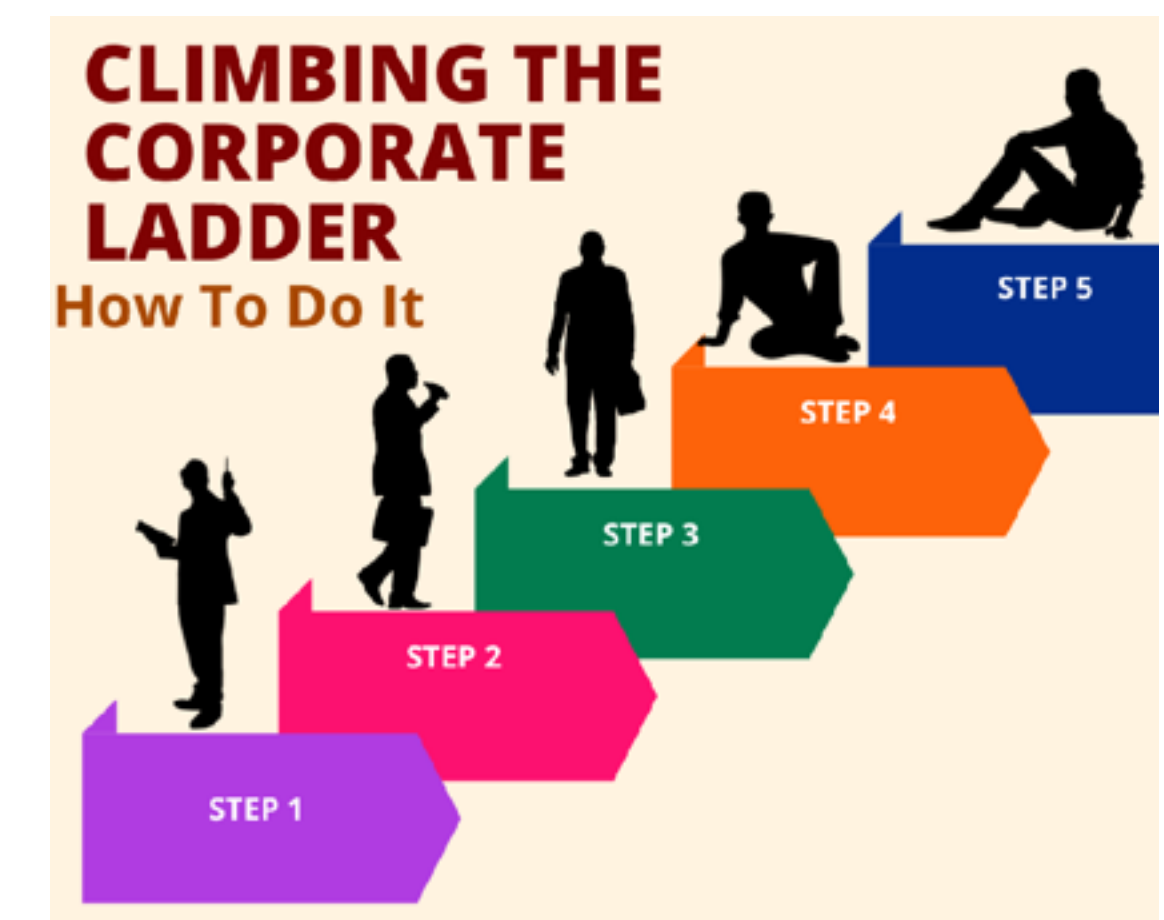
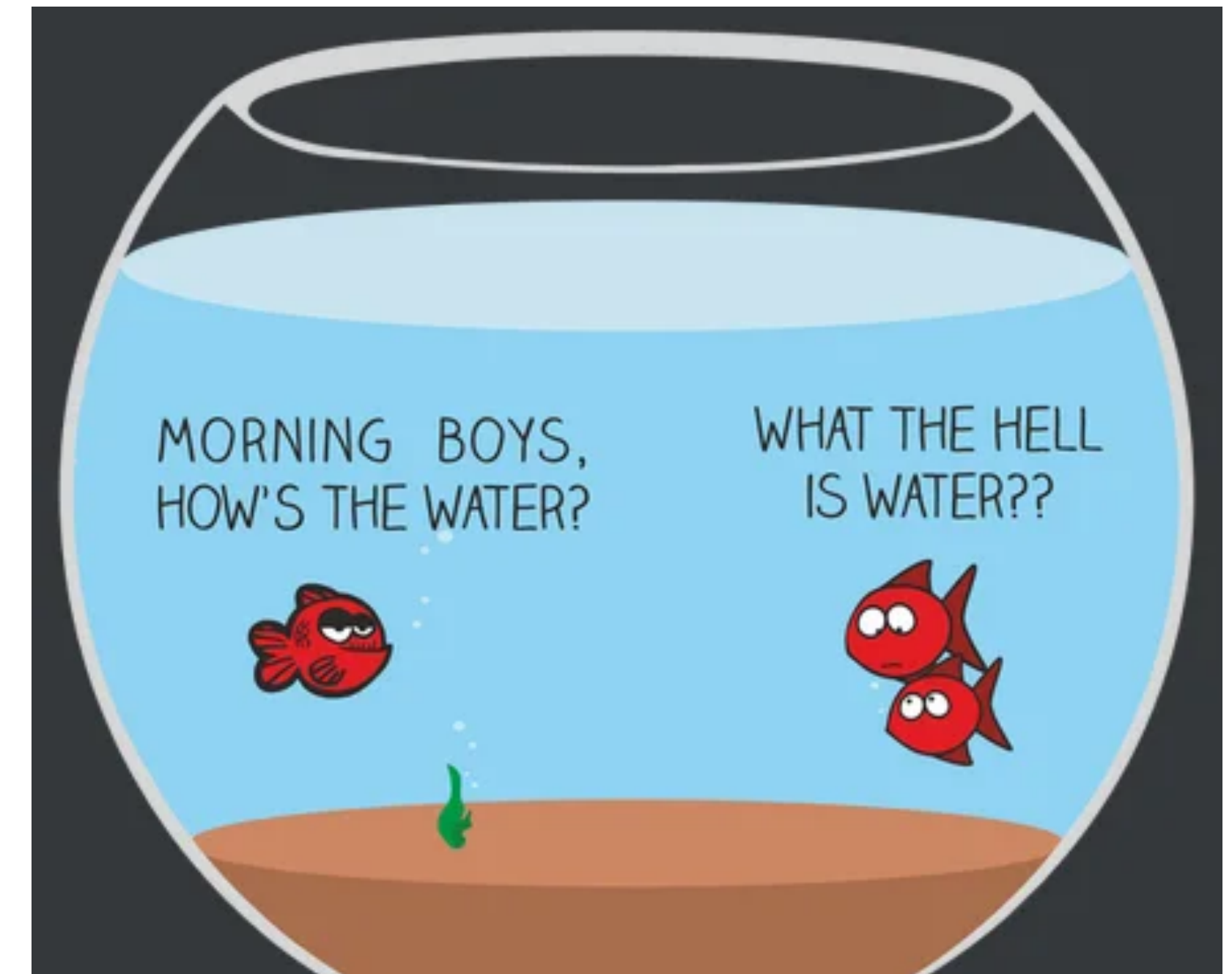


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Life becomes an exercise in figuring out *who* you are

 - Search for people driven by their passions



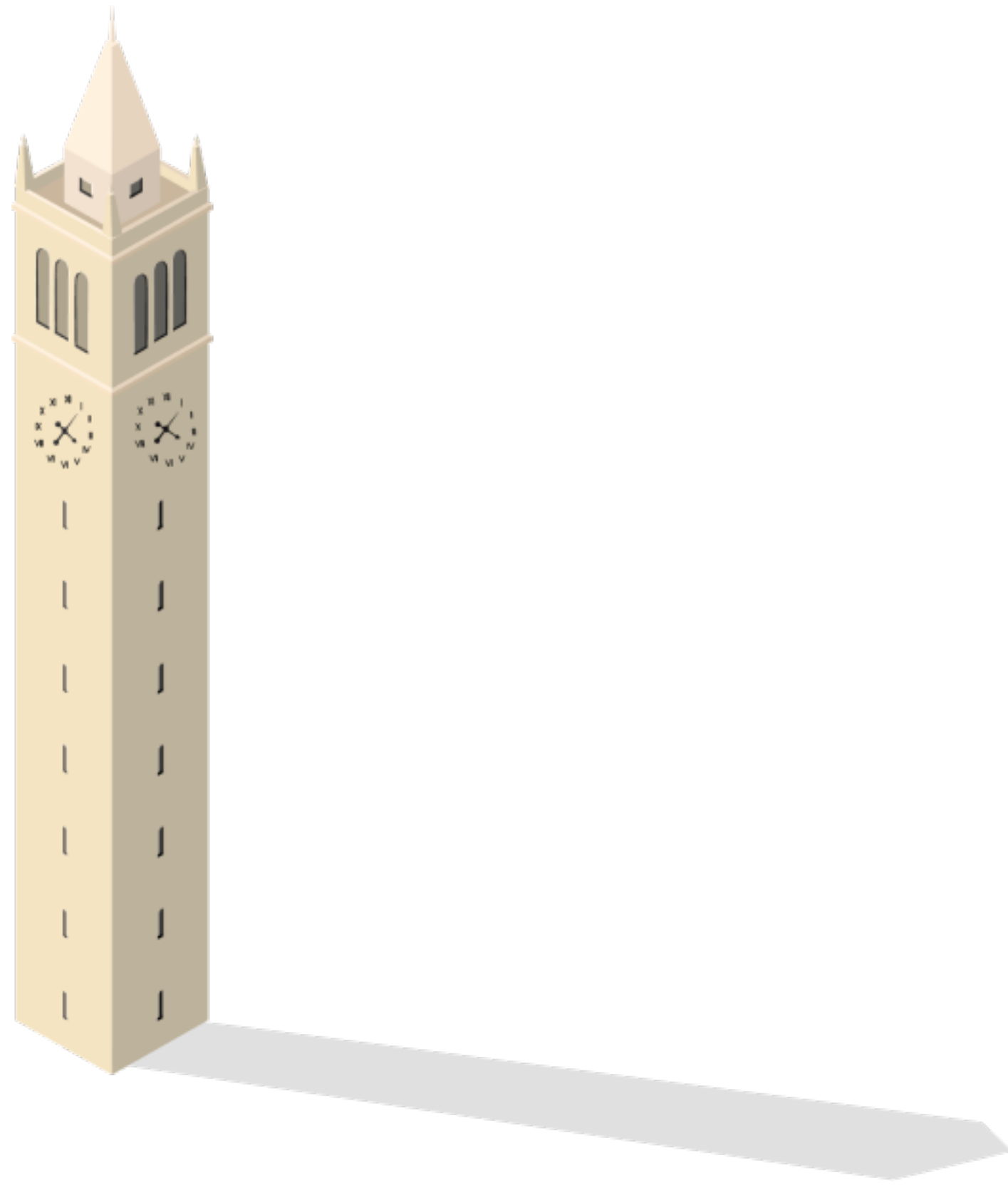
Agency is Key to Happiness
